Founded in 1939 by three Detroit area Lions Clubs, the Leader Dogs for the Blind provides guide dogs to people who are blind and visually impaired to enhance their mobility, independence, and quality of life. Each year over 270 students attend the 26 day residential training program to be paired with a guide dog. This is a life-

changing event that opens the door to independence, safety and self-worth for the students.

Thanks to generous donations from supporters, Leader Dogs for the Blind guide dogs services are provided free of charge to the students, including room and board and travel to and from the campus in Rochester Hills for those students living in North America.
