National Honor Society

Membership: Fifteen per cent of the graduating class chosen from the upper third in scholastic work. A student-faculty committee figures the points on the application handed in by the student candidate. These points are checked by a faculty committee; the final decision being made by the faculty as a whole.

Qualifications: Candidates qualify for the National Honor Society according to their Service, Leadership, Character, Scholarship, and Citizenship; each of these qualities being graded by points. The number of points depends upon the amount of school recognition given to these attributes and include such as number of hours required for a task, responsibility and dependability of the individual, etc. Points are also given for attendance and citizenship. In order to be considered, a student has to have a citizenship average of at least "2"

Activities: The group sells frostbites, the proceeds being used for the flower fund and club expenses. They also plan and carry out the Honors Conference at which time the group is initiated into the National Honor Society.
