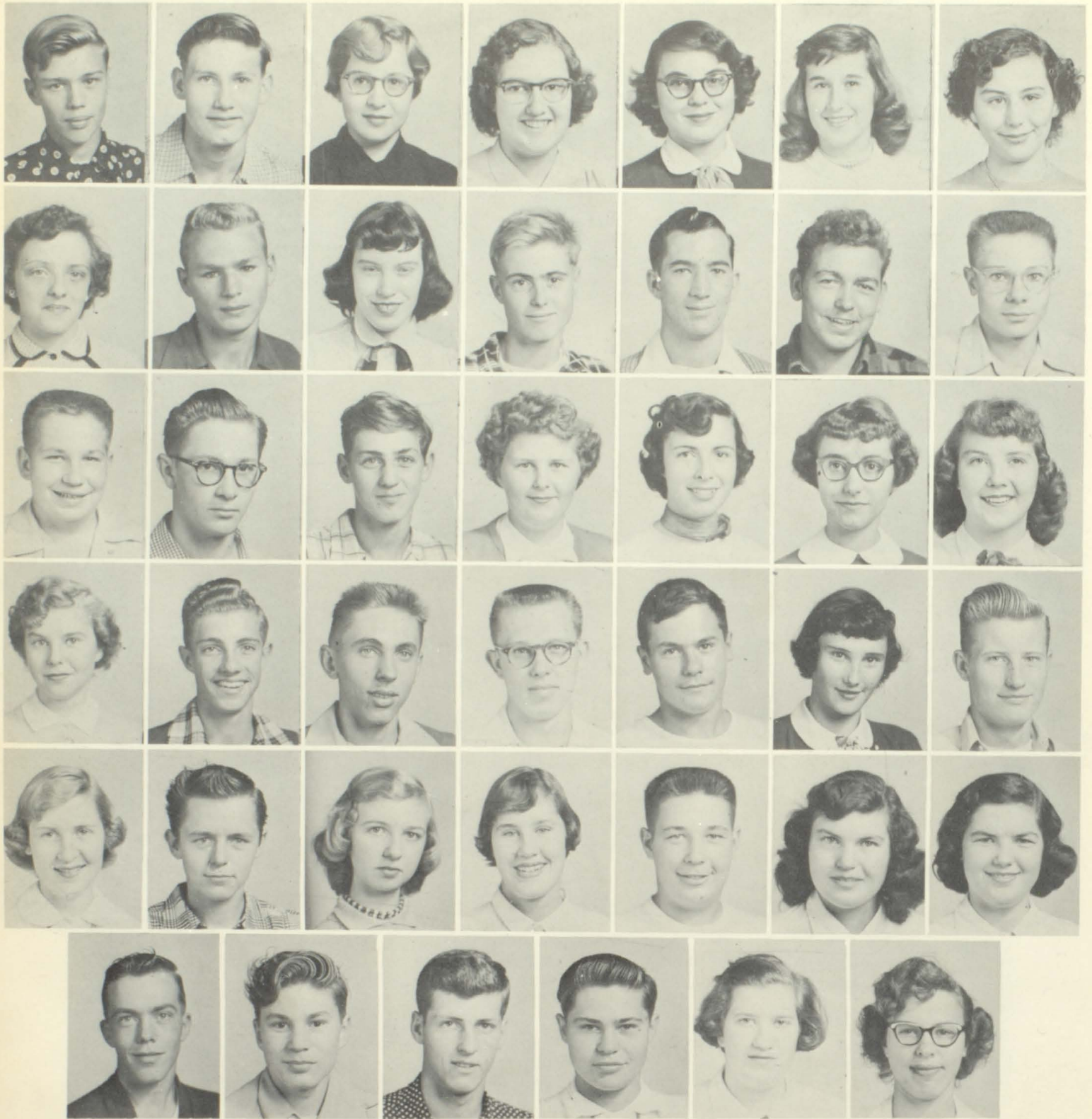
In addition to all their money making projects, the Juniors also found time to prepare a beautiful float for the Homecoming Parade.

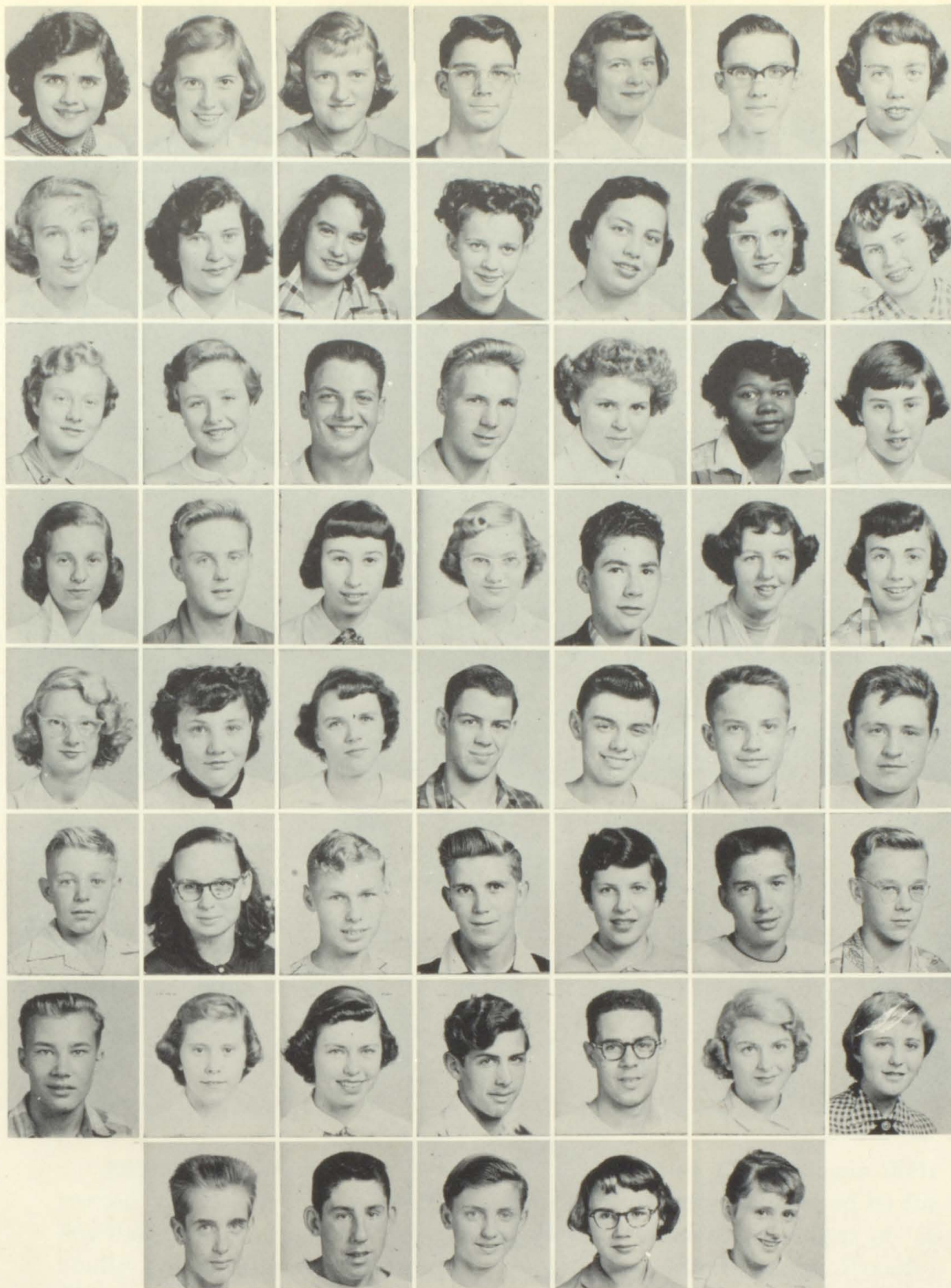

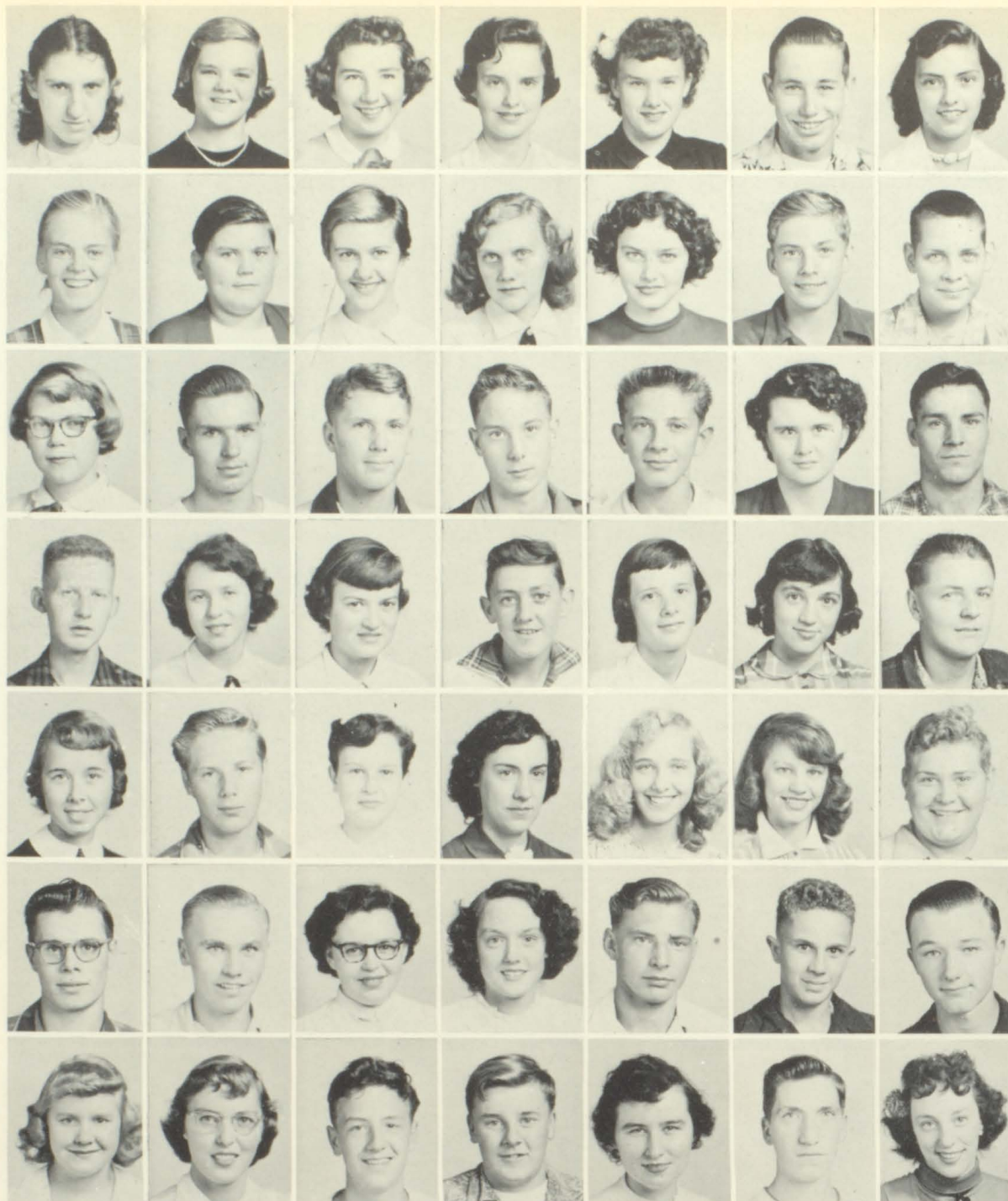
Sophomores

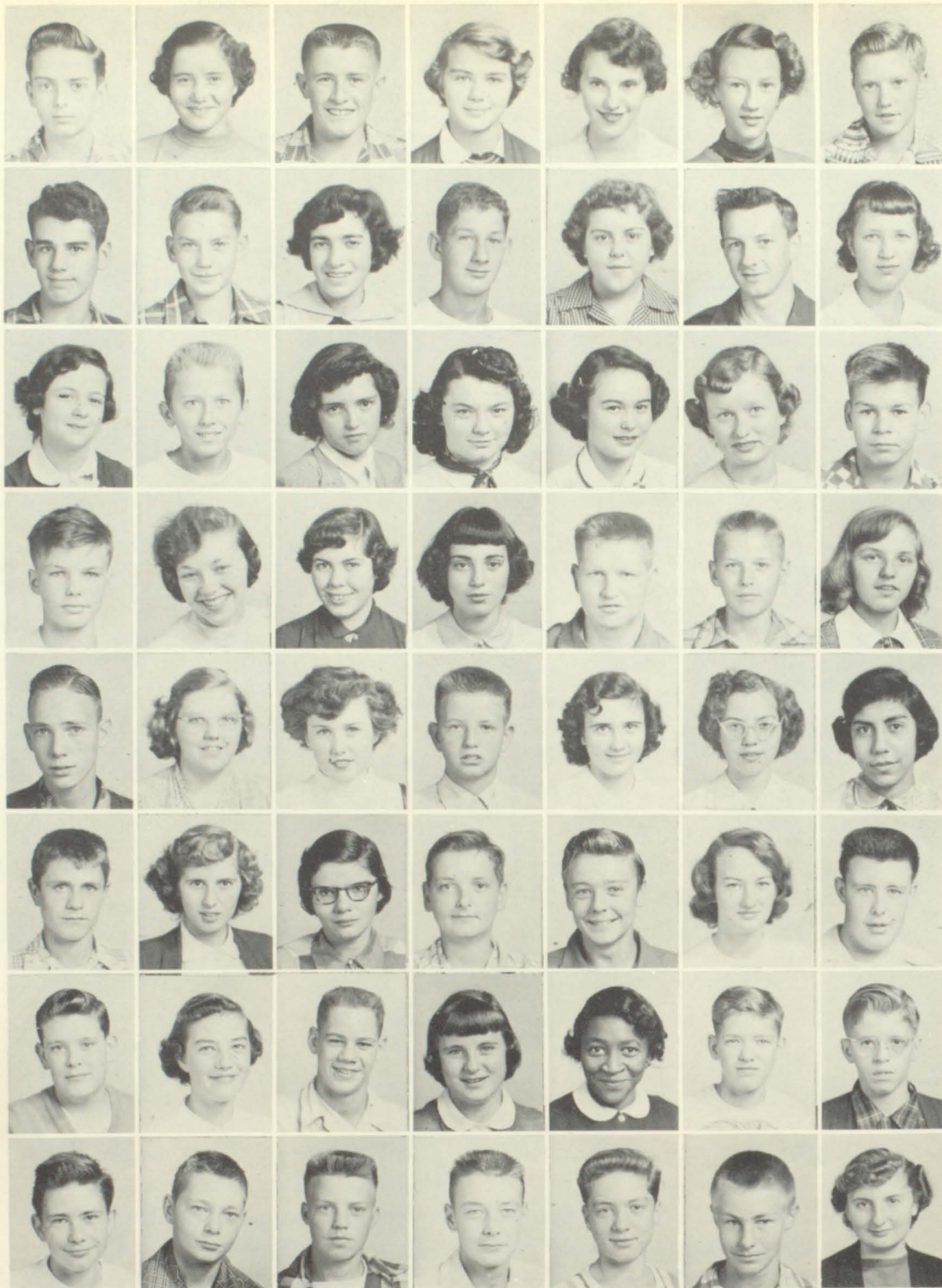

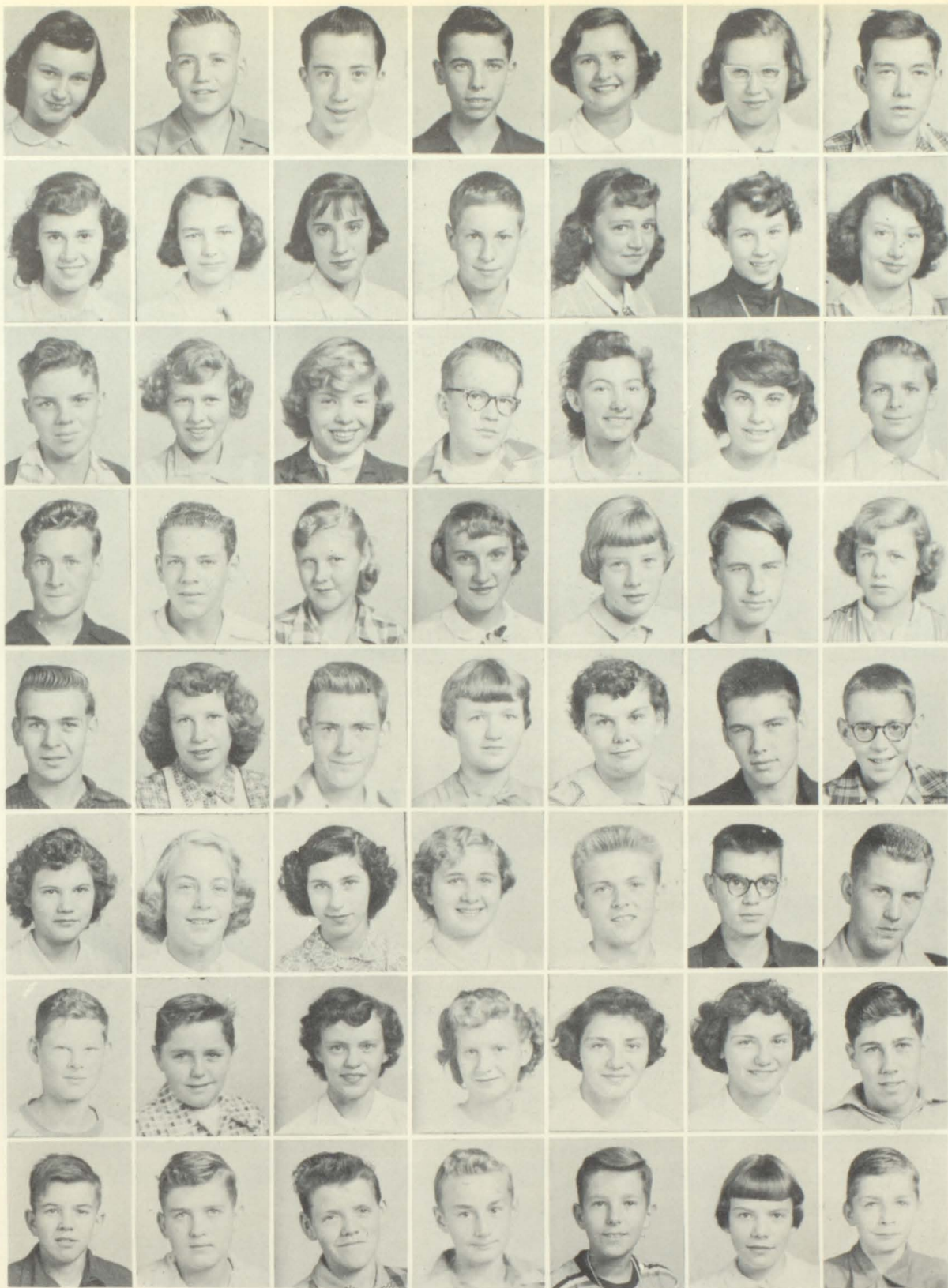

Freshmen

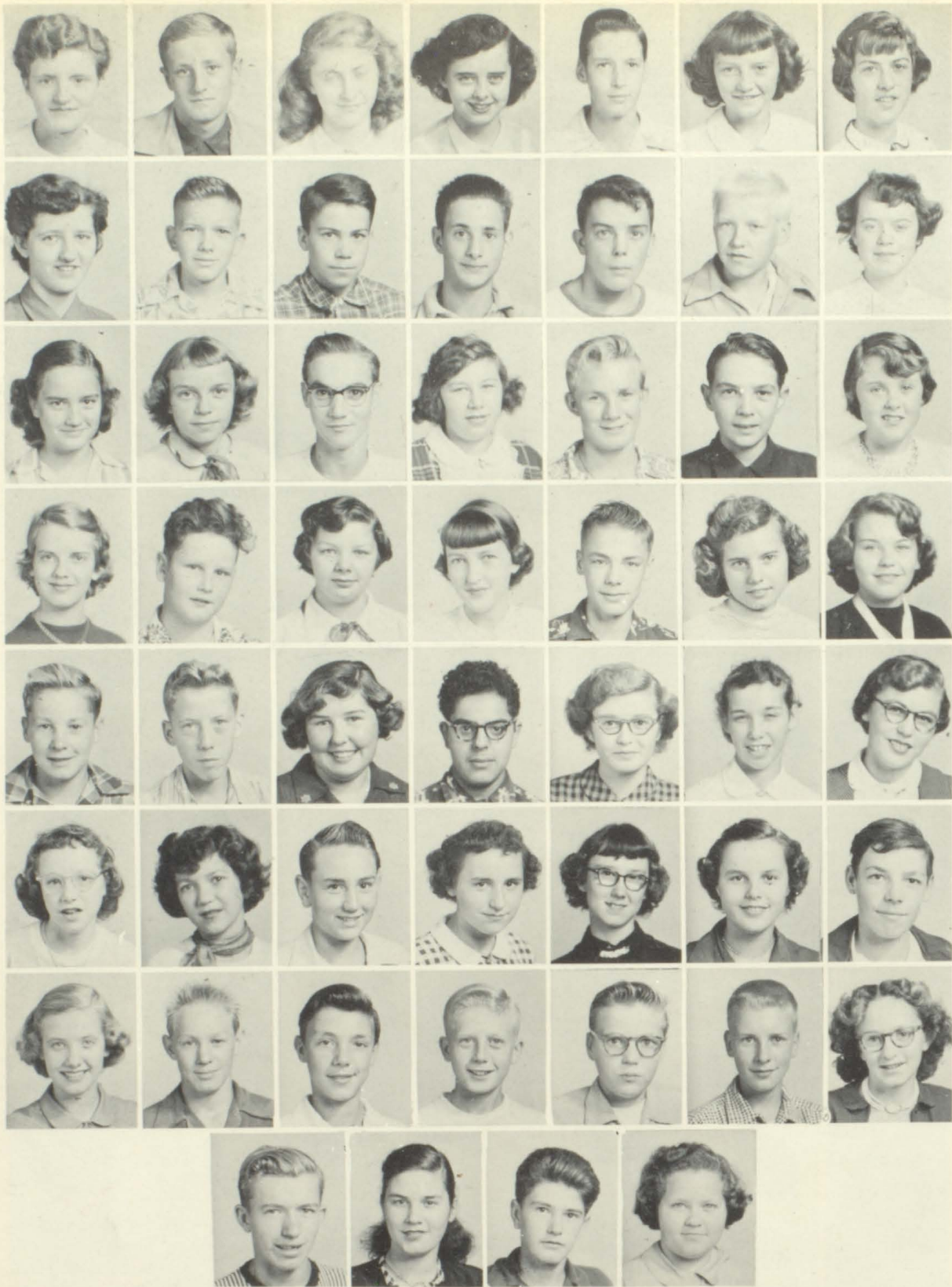

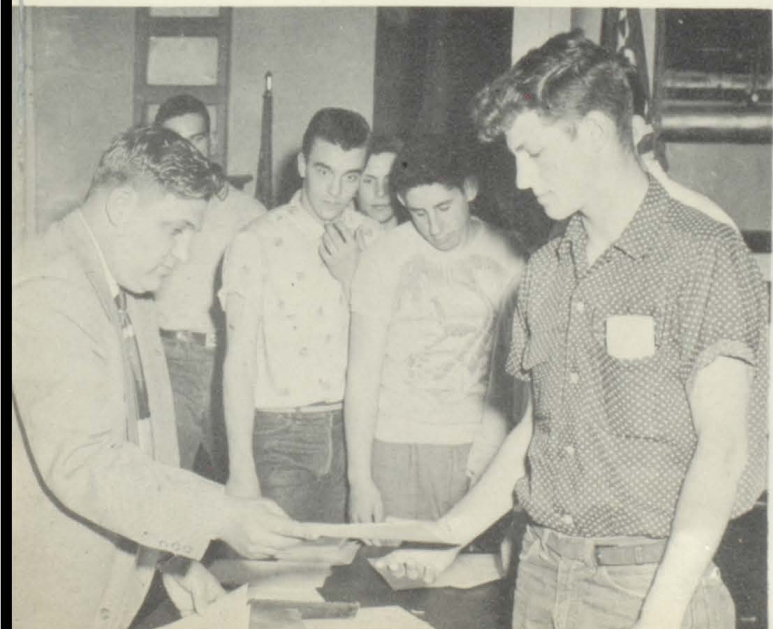


Council Activities

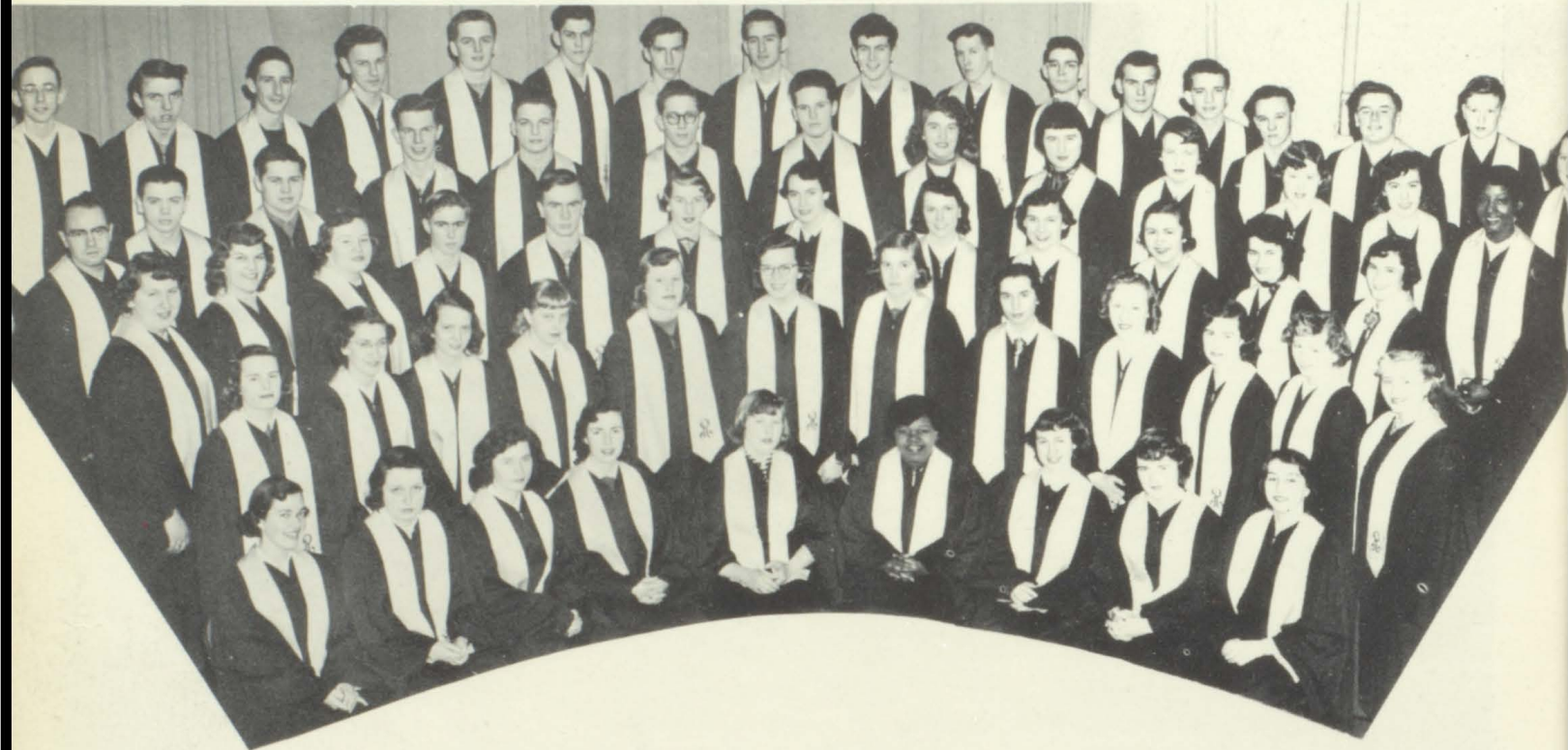

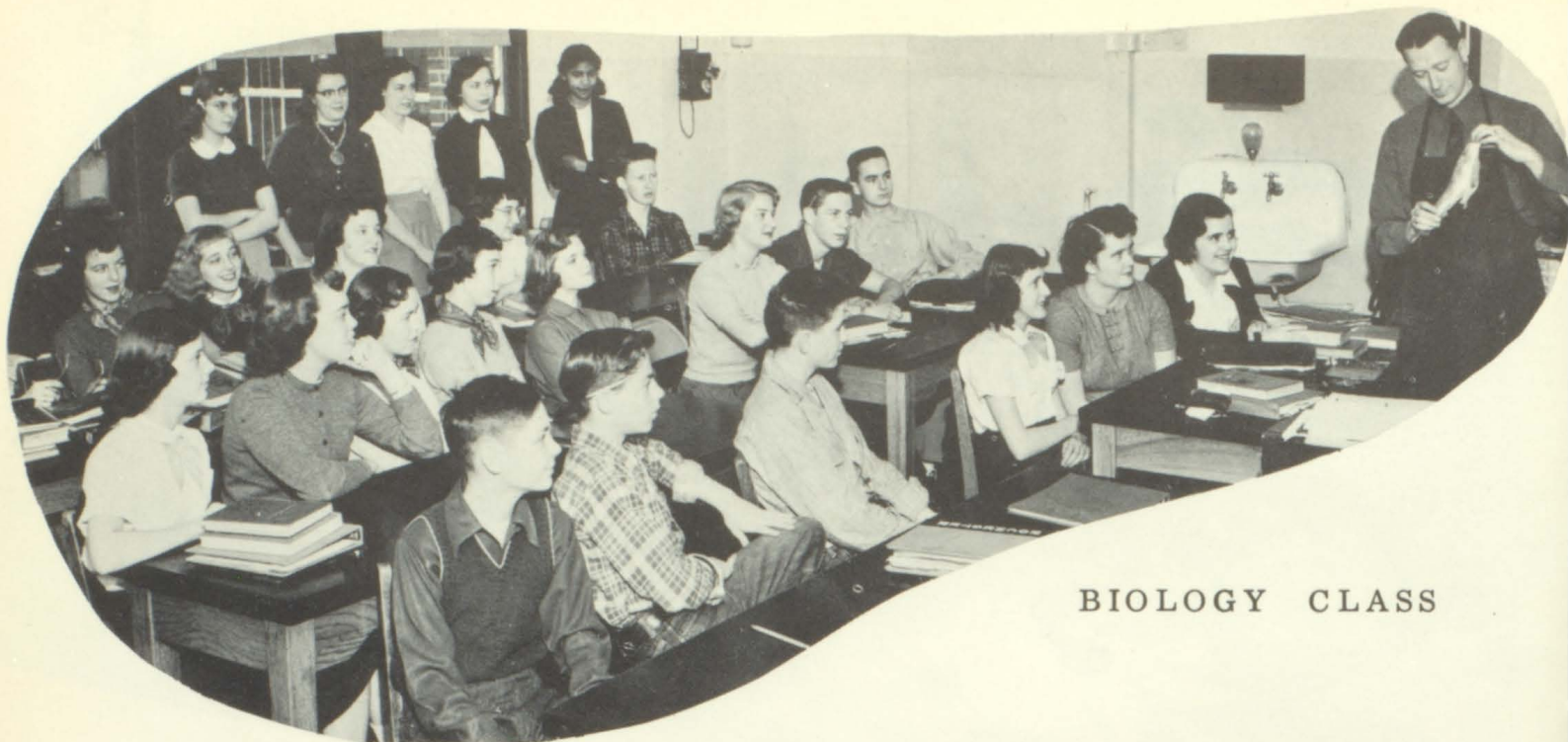


The aim of the Future Teachers of America, composed of students in grades nine through twelve, is to promote the interest in the teaching field and to give students an opportunity to work with children.

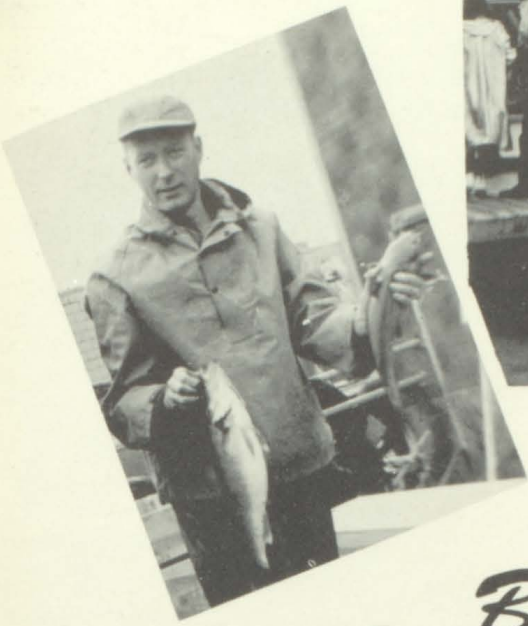
BIOLOGY CLASS

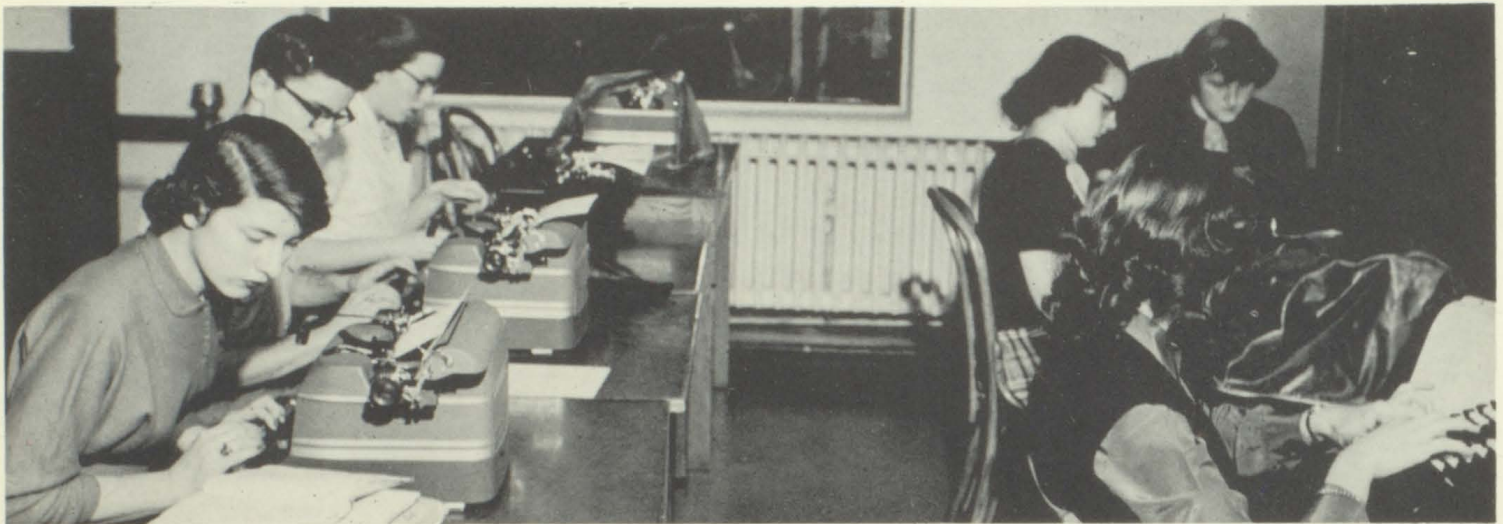


Vocational
