





To the eye, a school is bricks, steel and concrete arranged in a systematic manner.

A school is many things and Mr. Johnson's personality seems to fit them all.




GOVERNMENT


Thru the months of August to September, the members of Rochester's varsity football team were busily compiling a reasonably prosperous record. Out of nine games only three ended with Rochester losing.







She is still the same as ever, And her heart and soul still trod With the ones she used to walk with, But now she walks with God.


