Rochester Hills Public Library Board of Trustees Meeting

April 10, 2023

I. The Board of Trustees of the Rochester Hills Public Library held a regular meeting on Monday, April 10, 2023. The President called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm in the boardroom of the library. The presiding officer was Madge Lawson.

A quorum of the board was present including Anne Kucher, Julianne Reyes, and Chuck Stouffer. Melinda Deel entered the meeting at 7:05 pm. Bob Bonam entered the meeting at 7:06 pm.

Guests included Library Director Juliane Morian, City of Rochester Liaison Alice Moo and Oakland Township Library President, Michael Tyler.

Greg Soule, Partner at the audit firm Andrews Hooper Pavlik, PLC (AHP) was present; no other members of the general public were present.

- II. Presentation of the RHPL 2022 Audit
 - A. Mr. Soule presented a clean audit opinion for RHPL's fiscal year 2022. Mr. Soule left the meeting at 7:20 pm.
- III. Minutes
 - A. On a motion by Ms. Kucher, which Ms. Deel seconded, the board unanimously approved the regular meeting minutes from March 13, 2023 as presented.
 - B. On a motion by Mr. Bonam, which Mr. Stouffer seconded, the board unanimously approved the closed session meeting minutes from March 13, 2023 as presented.
- IV. Treasurer's Report was reviewed and filed.
- V. Monthly Bills
 - A. On a motion by Mr. Bonam, which Ms. Kucher seconded, the board unanimously approved the monthly bills for March 2022, which totaled \$390,880.55.

VI. Communications

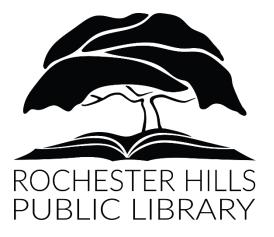
- A. The board reviewed and filed the communications with some discussion.
 - 1.Ms. Reyes stated that she felt that press coverage regarding an article from the New Republic was one-sided, unprofessional, and intentionally misleading regarding various statements she had personally made in the past. She asked Ms. Morian if Rochester Hills Public Library was asked for contribution to the article and if the alleged issues surrounding a harassing phone call in the workplace were accurate.
 - 2.Ms. Morian answered that the Rochester Hills Public Library was not contacted for comment or contribution.
 - 3.Ms. Morian said that details about a derogatory phone call to a librarian public service desk are unclear because the incident was not reported at the time, but it

is important to trust staff that it occurred. She went on to say that library staff need and want additional support because, increasingly, this profession is falsely accused of having a political agenda or accused of indoctrinating patrons. Ms. Morian recounted the steps library administrators and the board have taken over the past six months to strengthen employment policies and offer benefits that protect employees' wellbeing:

- a. Gov-7 Whistleblower Policy was a new policy the Board approved in September 2022 which provides guidance and protection for reporting inappropriate behavior witnessed at the library.
- b. Work-2 Anti-Harassment Policy was expanded in December 2022 to include gender identity and gender expression as a protected classification in regards to workplace conduct.
- c. Work-1 Employee Conduct was updated in February 2023 to be more inclusive surrounding an employee's gender identity and gender expression as protected classifications.
- d. Starting in 2023, RHPL provides a monthly benefit to all employees and allows them paid time for public service support group sessions facilitated by a licensed therapist.
- VII. Director's Report and Statistical Report
 - A. The board reviewed and filed the director's and statistical report with minor discussion.
- VIII. Committee Reports
 - A. Finance Committee met on April 6th with the AHP audit team to conduct an in-depth review of audit documents.
 - B. Centennial Celebration Committee met on March 23rd to discuss initial ideas related to the library's 100-year anniversary. Ms. Lawson stated that she anticipates there will be at least one event or commemoration each month of 2024 culminating in a large event slated for fall 2024.

 - A. Mr. Tyler commented that there are noticeable cracks in the asphalt on the south parking; he advised that they be patched or repaired.

How can I Avoid Paying Interest Charges? If you pay your New Balance in full by the due date each month, we will not charge interest on new transactions that post to the purchase balance. If you have been paying in full without Interest Charges, but fail to pay your next New Balance in full, we will charge interest on the unpaid balance. Interest Charges on Cash Advances and Special Transfers start on the transaction date. Promotional offers may allow you to pay less than the total New Balance and avoid paying interest on new transactions that post to your purchase balance. See the front of your statement for additional information.

<u>How is the Interest Charge Determined?</u> Interest Charges accrue from the date of the transaction, date the transaction is processed or the first day of the Billing Cycle. Interest accrues daily on every unpaid amount until it is paid in full. Interest accrued during a Billing Cycle posts to your account at the end of the Billing cycle and appears on your next statement. You may owe Interest Charges even if you pay the entire New Balance one month, but did not do so the prior month. Once you start accruing Interest Charges, you generally must pay your New Balance in full two consecutive Billing Cycles before Interest Charges stop being posted to your Statement. Interest Charges are added to the corresponding segment of your account.

Do you assess a Minimum Interest Charge? We may assess a minimum Interest Charge of \$0.00 for each Billing Cycle if your account is subject to an Interest Charge.

<u>How do you Calculate the Interest Charge?</u> We use a method called Average Daily Balance (including new transactions).

1. First, for each segment we take the beginning balance each day and add in new transactions and the periodic Interest Charge on the previous day's balance. Then we subtract any payments and credits for that segment as of that day. The result is the daily balance for each segment. However, if your previous statement balance was zero or a credit amount, new transactions which post to your purchase segment are not added to the daily balance.

2. Next, for each segment, we add the daily balances together and divide the sum by the number of days in the Billing Cycle. The result is the Average Daily Balance for each segment.

3. At the end of each Billing Cycle, we multiply your Average Daily Balance for each segment by the daily periodic rate (APR divided by 365) for that segment, and then we multiply the result by the number of days in the Billing Cycle. We add the Interest Charges for all segments together. The result is your total Interest Charge for the Billing Cycle.

The Average Daily Balance is referred to as the Balance Subject to Interest Rate in the Interest Charge Calculation section of this Statement.

NOTE: Due to rounding or a minimum Interest Charge, this calculation may vary slightly from the Interest Charge actually assessed.

How can I Avoid Membership Fees? If a Renewal Notice is printed on this statement, you may avoid paying an annual membership Fee by contacting Customer Service no later than 45 days after the last day in the Billing Cycle covered by this statement to request that we close your account. To avoid paying a monthly membership Fee, close your account and we will stop assessing your monthly membership Fee.

How do you Process Payments? When you make a payment, you authorize us to initiate an ACH or electronic payment that will be debited from your bank account or other related account. - Account information: Your name and account number.

Description of Problem: If you think there is an error on your bill, describe what you believe is

appeared on your statement. You must notify us of any potential errors in writing. You may call

errors and you may have to pay the amount in question. We will notify you in writing within 30

• We cannot try to collect the amount in question, or report you as delinquent on that amount. 





Library Director's Report



Director's Report May 8, 2023

1. Website Launch

RHPL staff launched a redesigned website on Wednesday, May 3, 2023. A general announcement was sent to all patrons. The new website was developed to bring information about library events, premium resources, collections, and library news to the forefront. The new website was tested with real patrons to ensure maximum ease of use. The site has been designed to meet AA accessible standards (in compliance with web accessibility guidelines and ADA accessibility standards). Additionally, the online catalog has been refreshed for an improved search experience. One of the most significant changes with the new online catalog is called the roll-up feature where all formats of a given title are grouped together for browsability. To facilitate the transition, the standard URL (that many patrons have bookmarked) will forward to the classic catalog for two weeks. Afterward, catalog.rhpl.org will automatically forward to the new online catalog. The classic catalog will be renamed to opac.rhpl.org and will remain accessible for the foreseeable future.

The majority of the site functioned well upon launch with positive feedback from the community. There was a notable bug discovered after launch that all Polaris sites are experiencing and went unreported until RHPL's launch. It is related to lag time when a patron tried to log into their account and used incorrect credentials (correct credentials loaded fine) and we have escalated a fix for that issue to the ILS software company.

2. Banking Security Upgrades

Banking fraud is a constant security threat and RHPL is not immune or alone in fighting banking fraud. To this end, RHPL will be implementing new security measures to ensure that checks have a two-factor process of approval before they can be cashed. This will result in slightly higher fees, but is widely recommended as the best defense against banking fraud.

3. Facilities Updates

Limestone replacement and repair will begin in late May for the west entrance. The administration corridor door renovation and wall-covering update is scheduled for May and June. These upgrades were included and approved in the FY 2023 budget. I recommend an upgrade of approximately \$2500 to convert the under-utilized whiteboard in the board room into a mounted television with integrated camera.

Additionally we have received a quote to upgrade our meeting room and study room doors to hassle free key pad locks, which circumvents the need for the public to stop at the public service desk to obtain a key. This is an opportune time to consider upgrading all keyed doors to a uniform proximity key (Motorola's OpenPath product). I recommend utilizing funds from the contingency line item to cover the \$7,000 price differential and upgrade all proximity doors for uniform software and security.

4. <u>RHPL Special Events</u>

RHPL hosted a volunteer luncheon on April 21, 2023 hosted approximately 60 individuals for an appreciation lunch. RHPL has over 250 volunteers who assist in library operations. Those who volunteered more than 100 hours were invited to the luncheon. The majority of luncheon attendees are part of the five mini-branch libraries at RHPL maintains.

On April 29th, the Friends of RHPL hosted Wine, Wit, and Wisdom as an annual benefit for the library. Approximately 175 people were in attendance. The evening was comprise of six minprograms that guest could choose to attend with topics ranging from the history of the Selfridge Air Base to gardening at any age. In addition to the catered food and wine that attendees enjoyed, there was a silent auction and 50/50 raffle. The profits from this benefit evening are projected to be around \$12,000.
